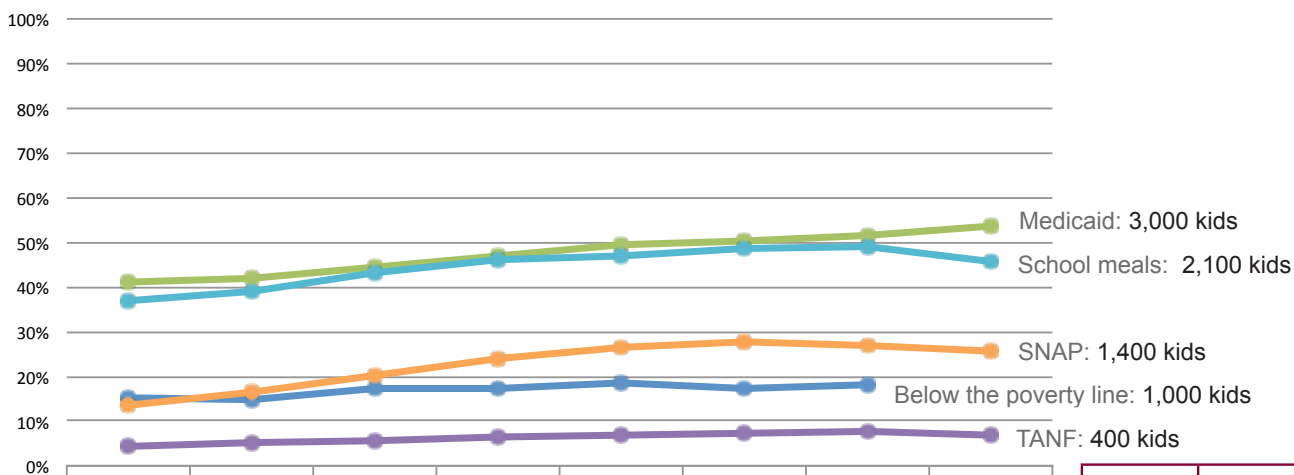

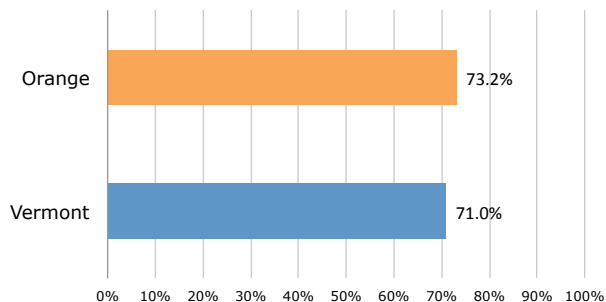

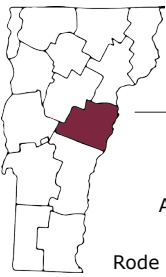
Percent of children ages 19-35 months who are fully immunized¹⁴

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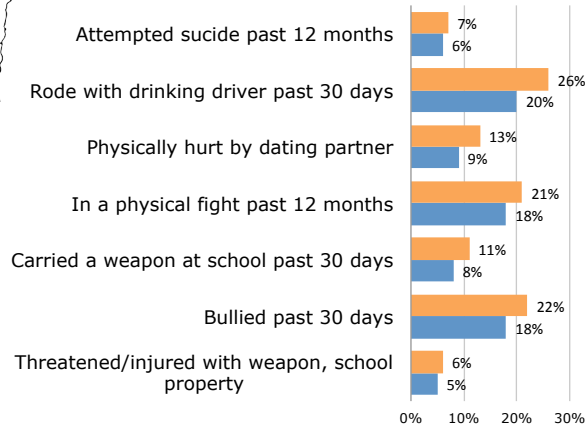

Child Protection, Barre and Hartford districts, 2015¹⁶

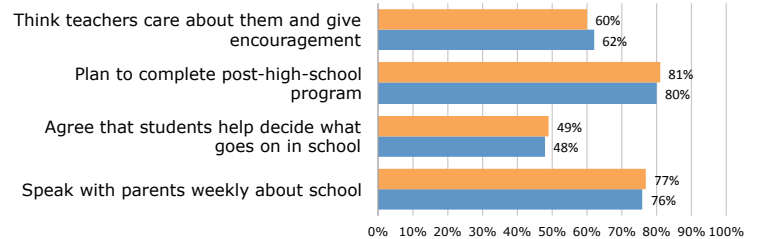
